You're Invited to The Unveiling of Pine Grove Cemetery's Historic Roadside Marker

On November 10 at 11a.m. Pine Grove Cemetery will be hosting an unveiling of their recently received historic roadside marker. A brief ceremony will precede the unveiling followed by a walking tour of the cemetery. This event is an opportunity to celebrate Charlton's history and all are invited.

Pine Grove has a long and interesting history with many of Charlton's early settlers buried there. Although not officially incorporated as a cemetery until 1848, burials have taken place at the Stage Road location since the 1770s. Of note is Pine Grove's connection with Freehold Presbyterian Church. In 1878 the church relocated a number of gravestones from their churchyard cemetery to Pine Grove. These are some of the oldest stones in the cemetery.

Holding the unveiling November 10, the day before Veteran's Day, also provides an opportunity to remember the nearly 100 veterans buried at Pine Grove including some from the Revolutionary War. Each Memorial Day American flags are placed at all veteran's graves.

Pine Grove received the marker grant from the William G. Pomeroy Foundation, which is committed to supporting the celebration and preservation of community history. The Foundation provides grants to 501(c)(3) organizations and municipalities to obtain signage in the form of roadside markers and plaques. It believes markers play an important role in educating the public, instilling pride of place in local residents and fostering historic tourism. To date, the Pomeroy Foundation has funded more than 540 Historic Roadside Markers in 53 New York counties.

We Bid Farewell

Since our September newsletter, we now bid farewell to two fine ladies, and long-time members of the Charlton Historical Society, who have passed away. We send our condolences to the family and friends of Nicole Allen and Marcia Adam. Nicole Allen passed away this past April 30th in Colorado, where her son John lives. Nicole also had a daughter, Bridget, who lives in Hawaii. Our long-time member, Jeanne Ferrante, has been a good friend of Nicole since 1954 and has let us know about Nicole's passing due to Parkinson's disease. Nicole volunteered many hours helping Estella VanderZee with museum exhibits and the inventory of Founders' Day buttons. She donated the collection of Indian tools made from rocks and an antler that Bill Wehrle has on display in the museum. Nicole was originally from France and helped me read letters from my friend there that are written in French. We don't have an obituary that can tell us more.

Marcia Jacobs Adam was also a long-time member of the Charlton Historical Society who just passed away on September 28th. Marcia was a friend of Mari Fettke who made us aware of Marcia's passing. Per Marcia's obituary, she was originally from Wellsley Hills, MA, married, moved to Schenectady, and then later moved to West Charlton. Marcia also resided in Smithfield, VA and for 25 years traveled between both residences. She was educated in Medical Technology and had a career in this field. Marcia loved horses, dogs, sailing, gardening, music, her churches and especially her family. Her obituary describes a very rich and full life.
