


November 4th @ 5-8pm-BHBL Rotary Pie Festival

CELEBRATING 40 YEARS IN WEST CHARLTON

Charlton, NY is 32.96 square miles. It may be considered small in size, but is vast in agricultural resources and has been fortunate to retain its rural beauty. Agriculture continues as the town's main industry.



Join us in celebrating the 40th anniversary of Anderson Acres farming in our community. The farm became operational by Jay and Judy Anderson in 1985. Today, they still own and operate the farm with their son's Dan and Joe Anderson with their families. The farm is located in West Charlton, at 52 Western Avenue (one of the houses listed in the Charlton House Letters, house and barns built between 1832 to 1882). They also have the famous blue and white tent farm stand in the summer months at 2399 State Highway 67. https://www.facebook.com/andersonacresny/



This farm proudly offers pasture raised, grain finished, all natural Certified Angus beef, hay, cut flowers, a large variety of seasonal produce picked fresh daily from gardens including sweet corn, tomatoes, herbs, melons, squash and more. Anderson's third generation has had a focus on raising, breeding, and showing Tunis sheep. It's wonderful to see how far Colin has gone since starting a 4-H sheep project 10 years ago. The family is proud to be "Growing since 1985 and providing what we grow to our community."

Remembering Torben and Jean Aabo

Torben Aabo, age 85 and Jean Aabo, age 78, of Charlton, NY, went home to be with the Lord on Tuesday, November 25, 2025 after a tragic accident.

Having gone to their celebration of life on December 3rd, I learned that Jean was born on July 4, 1947, to Kathryn and Paul Falotico in Westwood, NJ. Torben was the love of her life and they were married for 56 years. They raised their two children, Christina and David. Jean loved many things including their Charlton Sweetman Farm, animals, dogs, 4-H activities, family trips, traveling, grandchildren, volunteering, her church and Jesus. Jean was warm and had spirit of adventure.

Torben was born in Hanerup, Denmark on August 28, 1940, to Karl Sander and Nina (Iversen) Aabo. He accomplished so many things including second lieutenant in the Royal Danish Air Force, marrying the love of his life, and immigrating to America to follow the American dream. He was an electrical engineer and starting a consulting engineering company. He authored and coauthored more than 25 technical papers and articles and operated Power Cable Consultants until 2021.

He loved Charlton and was active in the Saratoga County 4-H, the Charlton Historical Society-President and grounds and maintenance, securing preservation of the One Room Schoolhouse in Charlton, setting up the committee to restore Taylor Hall- the first Town Hall in Charlton, president of the Charlton Seniors, and being member of the Ballston Center Church. All of this and he was humble.

He is standing in front of the One Room Schoolhouse in Charlton and the article explains his intention of renovating the building into a community hall to be used for meetings, exhibits and art shows.

The Aabos have been members of the CHS for many decades and Torben did a lot of the renovation work on the schoolhouse. He also worked on the Charlton House Letters. They will be missed!

He was also a board member of **Charlton Historical Society** and President of Pine Grove Cemetery for many years.


